





Update by Emergency Management, Harper

Potts: Good afternoon everybody. We will go straight into the update and numbers. Since day one, which was 23 months ago or in March 2020:

3693 Total Cases in Maskwacis 3067 Recovered 613 Active Cases in Maskwacis 8 Hospitalized

23 Deceased

613/212 are Samson band members

32 Homes with Positive Cases/Close Contact 900 Homes in Samson

170 Homes Approximately with Positive Cases/Close Contact

This does not include the Home Test Kits with Positive Cases

700 Active Cases Approximately Then Including Home Test Kit Numbers

Alberta Health Services statistics

55.685 Cases

People who test positive and who are double vaccinated have to isolate for 5 days but show no symptoms. People who test positive but show symptoms have to isolate for 10 days. Harper would like to see the 10 day isolation requirement for everybody.

Home Testers please call the Maskwacis Health Services (MHS) if you or someone in your family tests positive. Please do not go to the Ambulance bay to confirm your test, call MHS and they will assist vou.

Home Tests can be delivered by Emergency Management, so call 780-585-2522.

We need the number of people in the house and your names. Food hampers were delivered to the Pigeon Lake people. All 72 houses got food hampers.

Emergency Management hours are 9 AM to 3 PM. We will leave the Home Tests with Emergency Management Security and they will give it to you when you go see them. The Elders and people with disabilities got food hampers. We will deliver to homes with positive cases and we can give out sanitization packs as well.

Here is a big thank you to Farm and Ranch. When you see the Keith Nepoose or the other workers from there say thank you because they got a donation of 2000 pounds of potatoes that got delivered with the food hampers.

Employees will be tested every Monday morning with Antigen tests. Forms will have to signed out by the workers when this happens. This will go on until the variant is gone. This may go on until July. Harper has heard that the Elders said that the variant can be here for 4 to 5 years.

The band office is closed. MESC is closed. All these decisions are done in consultation with other departments, agencies and individuals. The Public Works and the Trades Center is open. The Vaccine Clinics will be from 1 PM to 6 PM at the HBMC to accommodate the workers. You can get the 4th vaccine but you have to fit the criteria so ask the Head Nurse when you go to the HBMC if you gualify. The Homeless Shelter has been shut down because the increase in numbers. Once the numbers go down it will be open and this was done in consultation with the town shelter, the Mustard Seed and Samson Community Wellness.

A few more numbers from the IRS population CHIP program:

December 31, 2021: 12, 520 Population in Maskwacis November 26, 2021: 12, 852 Population in Maskwacis. 1st Dose: 6823 2nd Dose: 5405 3rd Dose: 538

That's close to the numbers Samson has. Doctors in the Ontario region have stated that the variant has peaked. Harper believes that in two weeks the same will be for Maskwacis. Home Tests: Call 780-585-2522. There's 5 tests in a box and don't test every day, test every three days.

Check the Samson Emergency Management Facebook page for updates and you can call Harper's cell phone if you have to: 780-335-0303 if you need assistance. Thank you, stay safe, get vaccinated, wear your mask and stay home if you can. Please say some prayers for the families that are affected.



POSITIVE HOME TESTS

If you have taken a home test that you received from the DEMS, the schools or from neighboring communities and it is positive, please be reassured that it is accurate.

Please do not proceed to the ambulance bay or to the test site in your community to validate the test. This will help decrease wait times at the ambulance bay & test sites.


IF you have a positive home test, please advise Community Health by

calling 780-585-2266 between 9 am-3 pm Monday to Friday.

Your name(s) will be added to the positive home test list. The Contact Tracers will follow up with you as soon as possible.

While waiting for a phone call, please isolate, stay home, inform your close contacts to monitor for symptoms of covid, and if they are having symptoms, proceed for testing.

Alternately, you can share your result with your DEM who will inform the MHS contact tracers, we will follow up with you as soon as possible.



Also the COVID-19 vaccination rate in Maskwacis continues to lag behind other jurisdictions in Canada. As we know the COVID-19 vaccines continues to be your best bet against severe outcomes, including hospitalization and death, and to slow or stop person-to-person transmission in those who lack immunity. The ISC-AB Medical Officers of Health strongly recommend First Nations aim to have at least. 80% of eligible persons (70% minimum) fully immunized (first and second doses) against COVID-19

Lifting restrictions at this time in Maskwacis, from a public health perspective, is not optimal. The Directors of Emergency Management for the 4 Nations and Maskwacis Health Services recommend that all restrictions that were in place prior to February 8, 2022 announcement from the Alberta Government regarding the easing of restrictions remain in place. These will be reassessed on a weekly basis and be eased in Maskwacis when vaccination rates are above 80% for all those eligible and/or hospital rates stabilize.

We encourage anyone who has not fully immunized to do so. We are also recommending to continue the use of masks for everyone as we know the hightransmissible Omicron variant spreads through aerosols and droplets.



What are my records?

- Your records are: your IAP or ADR application form
- · the printed record (transcript) of your testimony
- · the voice recording of your testimony, and
- · the decision on your claim.

Where are my records?

Your records are being kept securely at the IAP Secretariat.

And my other records?

The IAP Secretariat is required to destroy other records after the end of your claim, such as your medical and employment records and other documents used in deciding your claim.


Anyone else who had copies of your records because they were involved with your hearing-such as the Government of Canada or a church-is required to keep them coeffidential and clestroy their copies after they are no longer needed for your claim.

Why am I being asked about

my records now? In October 2017, the Supreme Court of Canada decided what happens to IAP and ADR records after claims are linished

The Supreme Court ruled that you were promised confidentiality and that promise is being kept. As a claimant, you and you alone choose what happens to your records.

What are my choices?

- · You may do nothing. Your records will remain confidential. On September 19, 2027 they will be automatically destroyed.
- · You may get a copy for yourself, to keep or to share with others.
- · You may choose to preserve your records at the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation (NCTR) for history, education, and research.
- · You may choose to get a copy for yourself and also preserve them at the NCIR.

THE CHOICE IS YOURS, AND YOURS ALONE.

Privacy of other people

If you get a copy of your records for yoursell, or have them preserved at the NCTR, information that identifies other people will be blocked out. That way, you control what happens to your records and the privacy of others is respected.

If you made a claim in the

 Independent Assessment Process (IAP) or Alternative Dispute Resolution process (ADR)

This booklet has important information about your confidential records.

The IAP is the process for compensating daims of Indian residential school abuse. The deadline for IAP applications was in 2012.

The ADR was the earlier process for the same types of claims.

The NCTR was created to preserve the history and legacy of Canada's residential schools. It has a responsibility to foster truth, reconciliation, and healing.

Hosted at the University of Manitoba, it is the permanent home for the records of the Truth and Reconciliation

The NCTR welcomes those who made IAP or ADR claims to add their records to this collection. Preserving your records at the NCTR will help future generations understand the history and impacts of residential schools.

How would my records be used at the NCIR?

NCIR records will be used for education and research. If you choose to include your records, you may choose either restricted or open access.

 Restricted access means your personal information will not be available to the public. It will be available to the NCTR and authorized researchers but won't be available to the public or to your family, and won't

· Open access means that your records and personal nformation may be shared with the public, which may include your family.

Your personal information is your name and other information that could be used to identify you.

The NCTR is committed to the respectful use of your records. Records are kept in a secure database managed by carefully trained staff. However, there is always some risk of unauthorized use or disclosure.

What do I need to do?

To keep your records confidential you don't need to do anything. On September 19, 2027 they will be destroyed

To get a copy of your records you must complete a request form and send it to the IAP Secretariat.

To ask the IAP Secretariat to send your records

to the NCTR, complete a consent form and send it to the Secretariat. To get these forms or more information. use the contact information on the back of this bookfet.

If you choose to get a copy of your records or preserve them at the NCTR, you have until September 19, 2027. But you don't have to wait until then. If you die or become unable to make decisions for yourself, nobody else can make the choice for you.

To get help

Resolution Health Support Workers (RHSWs) can answer questions and help with forms. To find an RHSW in your area, call the toll-free lines listed on the back, or ask your band office.

For emotional support and crisis referrals, the free, 24-hour Residential Schools Crisis Line is available until September 19, 2027.

EMOTIONAL SUPPORT

What is Emotional Support?

Emotional Support is talking to someone who can help you understand your Indian Residential School experience in a safe way.

Who is a Resolution Health Support Worker?

A Resolution Health Support Worker is a person who will give you emotional support to help you safely address issues related to Indian Residential School.

How can a Resolution Health Support Worker help?

The Indian Residential Schools Settlement Agreement processes can be emotionally difficult and it can be frustrating trying to understand all the forms. This is why it can be helpful talking to someone who understands the process, like a Resolution Health Support Worker

Family members may also find it heloful to talk to someone as they may want information and to understand how they were effected by their parent's experiences. They too can discuss these issues with a Resolution Health Support Worker.

Resolution Health Support Workers:

- · Listen and talk to you about your Indian Residential School experiences.
- Listen and talk with you as you go through the Independent Assessment Process.
- · Guide you through the Common Experience Payment process.
- Emotionally support you before, during. and after your Independent Assessment Process hearing, Alternative Dispute Resolution hearing, or court process.
- Attend and provide emotional support at community, regional, and national Truth and Reconciliation and Commemoration events.
- Refer you to appropriate services you may need including cultural support. professional counselling, and transportation.

What is Cultural Support? Cultural Support is the traditional healing component of the Resolution Health Support

Program

Who is a Cultural Support Provider?

A Cultural Support Provider is a traditional healer or practitioner in your community. They are recognized and respected as a person who provides and performs traditional ceremonies or prayers.

How can a Cultural Support Provider help?

- · They provide cultural support and traditional healing before, during and after:

AJS trains local employees in the different processes to get the job done, from project managers, public works to the hammer swingers!

Down Home Movers is the company who moved the unit and will put it on the piles. They are from Winkler, Manitoba and travelled to Alberta in the past few days where they encountered the snow storm we just went through.

Allan was saying he brought some treats for the town site dogs. As for the modular units, there will be six more delivered after this week. The homes are being bought under a government program. Allan is just proud to do his job when I mentioned motivation for the project. Project Manager Cody Nepoose helped in this project along with the Housing Committee, Councilor Kurt Buffalo, Armond Swampy and Myles Rain.

If yes, this notice is for you. It is authorized by the Federal Court, Picase read it carefielty because it affects your legal rights.

What is this notice for?

There is a settlement in a certified class action called Graphindron v. Canada (Federal Court File No. T-1542-12) for the chains of Day Scholars rite "Survivor Class") and their children (the "Descendant Class"). Day Scholars are students who attended Indian Rasideetial Schools during the day only sed did not slorp there oversight. A Federal Coart judge approved the settlement agreement or September 24, 2021, and that agrorment is now binding on all Servivor Class and Descendant Class members who did not opt out.

What settlement was approved?

The settlement contains benefits for both the Day Scholar Surviver Class and the Desendant Classes.

- S18,800 Day Scholar Compensation Payment: Each Day Scholar who attended an Iadian Residential School during the day only that did not slarp them overtaight) any time between 1920 and 1997 in eligible to apply for a \$19,800 Day Scholar Compensation Payment. A Size of Ballas Residential Schools that had or could have had Day Scholar can be found at the end of this Notee, and online at https://www.justconfundsychulara.com/schools-Sizh. Siz cases where the Day Scholar deal on or after May 30, 2005, the deceased Day Scholar's estate or heles may apply for the Day Scholar's state. Scholar Compensation Payment.
- · S90 million Day Scholars Revitalization Fund, Canada will pay \$50 million to the Day Scholars Revitalization Fund to be used to support healing, welfness, education, language, culture, heritage, and autometeorotation for the benefit of the Survivor and Descendant Classies. The funds will be nered by a non-profit society.






